There are handwritten notes: "Scarce unrecorded edition with photographic frontispiece" and "The book was in the wreck of the S.S. Wiltshire wrecked on the Great Barrier [Great Barrier Island] 1922". 




First published in 15 parts in the Maori Messenger 15 August 1850 to 14 August 1851, the Maori translation by C.O.B. Davis. Account of Governor Grey's journey to Taupo, an attempt to ascend Ngauruhoe, for which permission was disputed. The journal ceases abruptly before arrival at Tutakamoana. Includes numerous Maori legends such as Hinemoa and Tutanekai. Bagnall #1409. Rare, even as a facsimile edition.






